



Three Elected, One Re-elected to Foundation Board

Mrs. Martin S. (Luella) Davis of Greens Farms, Conn.; Richard Gilder of New York; and R. Crosby Kemper III of Kansas City, Mo., have been elected members of the Board of Trustees of the Thomas Jefferson Foundation, Inc., while Alice W. Handy of Charlottesville has been re-elected to the board.

All will serve four-year terms through 2006.













Mrs. Davis has served on the board since 1999, filling out the term of her late husband, Martin S. Davis. Gilder was a board member from 1994 through 2001.

Mrs. Davis is president of Wellspring Capital Management, an investment firm founded by her husband. A native of Great Britain, she is a naturalized citizen of the United States.

Gilder is a founding partner of the investment firm Gilder, Gagnon, Howe & Company. He is the co-founder, with Lewis Lehrman, of the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, and has served as a trustee of numerous organizations, including the American Museum of Natural History, Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites, and Manhattan Institute.

Kemper is chairman of the board and chief executive officer of the Kansas City-based UMB Financial Corporation. He has served on the boards of many institutions, including the Truman Presidential Library and Institute, Kansas City Symphony, and Jefferson National Park Association. His father, R. Crosby Kemper, is a former member
