Owl Prowl

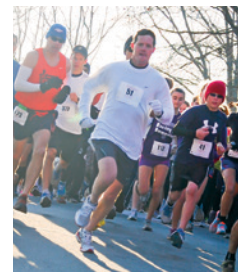
